


# Prince's Trust Achieve Level 2

## **Aims of Course:**

The Prince's Trust qualification in Personal Development and Employability Skills is a programme for young people from 16 - 19 to enable them to develop the skills and confidence needed to progress into a positive future. The units that are covered include units in personal development, money management and a personal project of their own choice. All units are aimed at increasing students' confidence, basic literacy and numeracy skills and relating these skills to the world of work.

## **Course Content:**

- Personal development unit – Compulsory unit which gets students to analyse their strengths and weaknesses, plan a programme of how to improve the skills they feel are weak and develops strategies to support this process.
- Money management unit – focuses on different banking facilities, budgeting and personal money management skills, preparing students for the next stage of life.
- Personal project unit – You have the freedom to choose your own topic and work independently. You can choose to write a dissertation; a report; create an artefact; a drama presentation; a community project or create a DVD or CD. It helps develop essential independent working and research skills.
- Once the above units have been completed, dependent on the overall interests of the group, one or more of the following units can be completed: Taking part in sport, team work, a community project, leadership, interpersonal and self-management, customer service, preparing for a healthy active lifestyle.

## **Mode of Assessment:**

Princes Trust Achieve is a one year course which is assessed through coursework only. There is no exam. Each unit has a clear tracking/task sheet stating what evidence is needed to meet the criteria for the unit but how that is presented is up to the student/group and can be done using written work, video evidence, photographic evidence, witness statements, posters/art work, presentations and any other form students can come up with.
