

ADMISSIONS TO SIXTH FORM

Adeyfield School is a foundation Trust school, which adheres to the admissions criteria of Hertfordshire County Council who manage the transfer of 11-16 admission to the school.

Admissions to the Sixth Form are the responsibility of the Headteacher and Governors and applications for admission should be made direct to the school, with a copy of the Post 16 options found on the school's website.

An agreed set of criteria have been developed within the East Dacorum Co-operative Learning Trust with personal guidance being given by each school to help students decide the level of courses that should be followed Post 16. As a guide, the details below indicate a good choice for different Attainment 8 (A8) scores, though in individual interviews the school places the interests of the individual student at the centre of any guidance and decision.

Attainment 8 score below 36

Students who achieve this A8 score should be considering a Level 2 package as a progression route Post 16. Each school within East Dacorum offers its own combination of qualifications, all of which include GCSE English Language and Mathematics.

Attainment 8 score between 36 – 40

Students who achieve this A8 score should be considering at least three Level 3 Post 16 courses that are a mixture of vocational and A-levels.

Attainment 8 score of 40 or more

Students who achieve this A8 score should be considering studying three A-level subjects.

Additional requirements

Adeyfield School is a comprehensive Sixth Form and does not select students on ability. Admittance to Post 16 is dependent on a student's attendance, attitude and behaviour. We expect Sixth Form students to be role models to the rest of the school and as such they should embody the three core principles of look smart, be polite and work hard. All students making an application to the Sixth Form are interviewed before being offered a place. The final offer of a place is not made until August when the GCSE results have been published.

Further Information

Adeyfield School offers students a wide range of experiences and is committed to securing the best possible outcomes for students. For all students attendance to RE, PSHE and PE are compulsory.

The school operates a strict dress code whereby students must present themselves in an appropriate way for work in a professional office. Male students must wear a shirt and tie and females appropriate office clothing. A full description of appropriate clothing is provided to students.
