Eight of Adeyfield's finest Year 10 students spent a day at BLP Law in the City of London on Thursday 29 June. Having been successful in their application process the students spent the morning at BLP, one of the City's leading law firms; fully attired in business dress and having commuted on train and underground.

After a tour of the impressive offices, students worked with legal trainees - developing a presentation on a topical legal issue. The presentations were delivered to partners of the firm who were extremely impressed by the students' skills and knowledge; with the feedback being universally positive.

Students then had an opportunity to meet with Chris Bryant - a partner in the firm - and hear his honest appraisal of the ups and downs of being responsible for multi-million pound lawsuits. Travel, late nights and tight deadlines were certainly at the fore. However, he also outlined how a career in law is possible to those of all backgrounds - he himself coming from a comprehensive school in Coventry.
