## Athletics Club

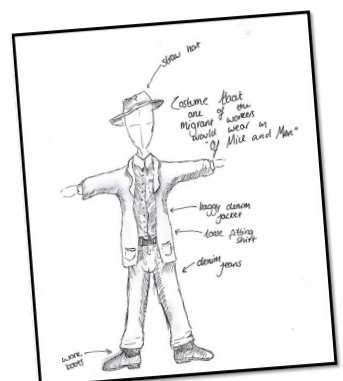
Athletics club is on Wednesday after school from 3.10pm. Come and get some practice before sports day. All those wanting to be involved in District Athletics are expected to attend.

## NUMERACY NINJAS

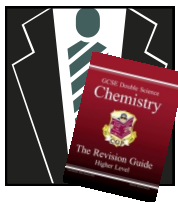
