Welcome to the start of the new academic year at The Adeyfield Academy. Now that the new term is officially underway, it has been wonderful to see our students settle into their classrooms with great energy and positivity, continuing to strive to be Five-Star Students across the school.

Over the summer holidays, significant work took place across the school site to update our facilities and ensure a safe, inspiring environment for learning. These site improvements included a complete refresh of all student toilets, new vibrant artwork in the Learning Resource Centre (LRC) and English faculty corridor, the replacement of 116 student locker locks, tree maintenance across the grounds, completion of 186 safety compliance checks, and the replacement of two incoming main gas lines

We are proud to highlight several fantastic events and accomplishments that have taken place across our school community. We celebrated impressive academic growth on GCSE Results Day, with the vast majority of our students securing

their top-choice post-16 destinations. Special achievements included students earning Grade 9s across multiple subjects, alongside outstanding individual tallies of up to 11 GCSEs

Our new Year 7 cohort enjoyed an action-packed Summer School over the break, building confidence through team-building activities and creative workshops Year 7 students have since taken part in a reading-focused visit, as well as an essential online safety assembly presented by The Breck Foundation

Students across all year groups participated in valuable conflict resolution workshops led by Herts Young Homeless. We were honoured to host award-winning broadcaster Ashley John-Baptiste as our special guest speaker, celebrating the dedication and resilience of our student award nominees.

The Adeyfield Academy has officially achieved the School Games Gold Mark Award for the third year in a row

Please take note of the upcoming dates and important notices for the weeks ahead, with Year 7 Testing: NGRT testing takes place on Friday 18th

September, followed by CATs testing on Friday 24th September. Year 10 students participate in Show Racism The Red Card on Friday 18th September, and Year 11 attend the Oli Leigh Foundation session on Monday 21st September. Year 8 will be taking part on Tuesday 22nd in the inspiring 'It's Not A Crime To Be Different' session delivered by Electric Umbrella.

The Adeyfield Academy Celebrates Success on GCSE Results Day with Rising Academic Results and Continued Growth



We are proud to highlight consecutive years of academic growth at The Adeyfield Academy. With overall Attainment 8 increasing by almost 10 points in the last few years, the continued year-on-year growth reflects widespread improvement across all subjects, including STEM and core disciplines. In English, students achieving grades 9-5 and 9-4 has improved by almost 20%. In Maths, grades 9-5 grew by 13%, with grades 9-4 rising 19% in the last three back-to-back exam cycles.

This consistent year-on-year growth, across all subjects is reflected not only in our expanding student intake, but also in our rising academic results—a true testament to the academy's ongoing upward trajectory. Headteacher Dawn Mason commended the cohort not just for their impressive exam success, but for the character, resilience, and personal qualities they demonstrated throughout their time at the school:

"We could not be prouder of our students and everything they have achieved. Throughout their time with us, this cohort has truly embodied our school values, setting the benchmark for what it means to be a Five-Star Student at the Academy. They leave us not just with fantastic qualifications, but as well-rounded, ambitious individuals ready to make their mark on the world."

Among the many inspiring individual successes, a particular highlight was Oliver

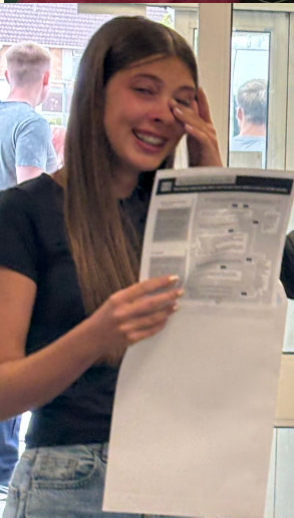
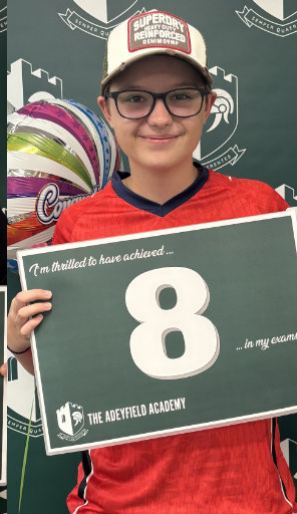
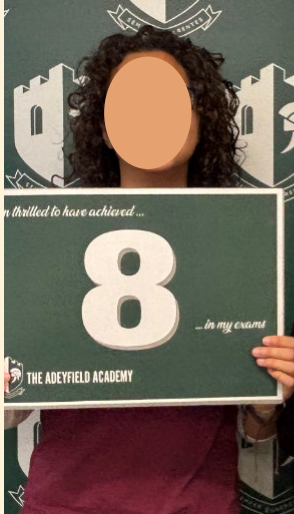
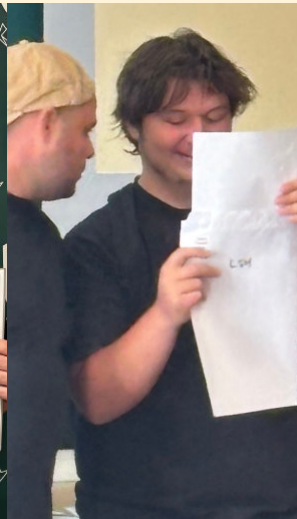
who achieved a Grade 9 across 6 subjects including Maths, Science and Geography as well as Teddy and Isabel who accumulated 10 and 11 GCSEs respectfully, 5 of which were a Grade 9. Head of Year 11 Jack Doodson reflected on the year group's journey:

A LEVEL & BTEC RESULTS

Higher average points per student and sharp rise in top grades highlight a year of exceptional academic achievement.

The Adeyfield Academy are pleased to announce another strong set of Key Stage 5 results for 2026, with it being their highest scoring year for points per student since 2022, with an improvement in overall pupil progress.

Grades exceeded the target for A*-A grades, with around 50% of all A Level grades A*-C, a significant improvement on last year's outcomes. When combining all A level and BTEC result the equivalent A*-C pass was 13% higher than last year.

Several individual students delivered exceptional performances across a range of subjects. The academy was particularly pleased to note that:

- History secured 50% A*-B grades.
- Biology achieved 40% A*-B grades.
- English and Maths both saw over 60% of students achieving A*-C grades.
- BTEC subjects saw 43% of all results awarded at Distinction or Distinction*.

Our graduates are now heading to top higher education destinations across the country, with Loughborough University, the University of York, and the University of Surrey among this year's standout destinations. Our highest ever percentage of students secured their first-choice place at University with many students destined for a Russell Group or Top Third University.s

SCHOOL IMPROVEMENTS

Over the summer break, our premises and marketing teams were hard at work behind the scenes to ensure our academy is safe, refreshed, and inspiring for the start of the new academic year. A huge amount of effort went into updating our facilities, improving safety, and creating engaging spaces for our students.

Here is a snapshot of what was completed across the school site over the holidays:

- All student toilets across the school have been fully updated and refreshed to provide cleaner, modern facilities for everyone.
- To make our learning environments even more welcoming, vibrant new artwork has been installed in both the Learning

Resource Centre (LRC) and the English faculty corridor.

- To ensure everything runs smoothly from day one, 116 student locker locks were replaced, and trees across the grounds were pruned or safely removed to keep our outdoor areas hazard-free.
- Safety and regulatory standards remain our top priority. The team completed 186 rigorous compliance checks and successfully replaced two incoming main gas lines to keep the site running safely and efficiently.

SUMMER SCHOOL

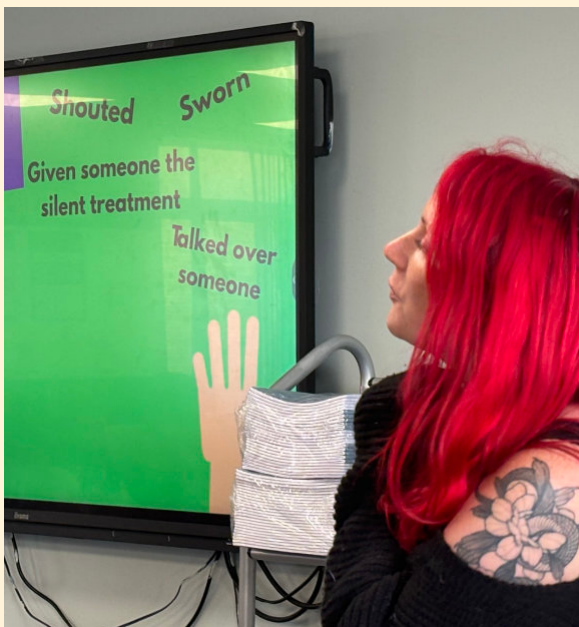

PARENT INFORMATION EVENINGS

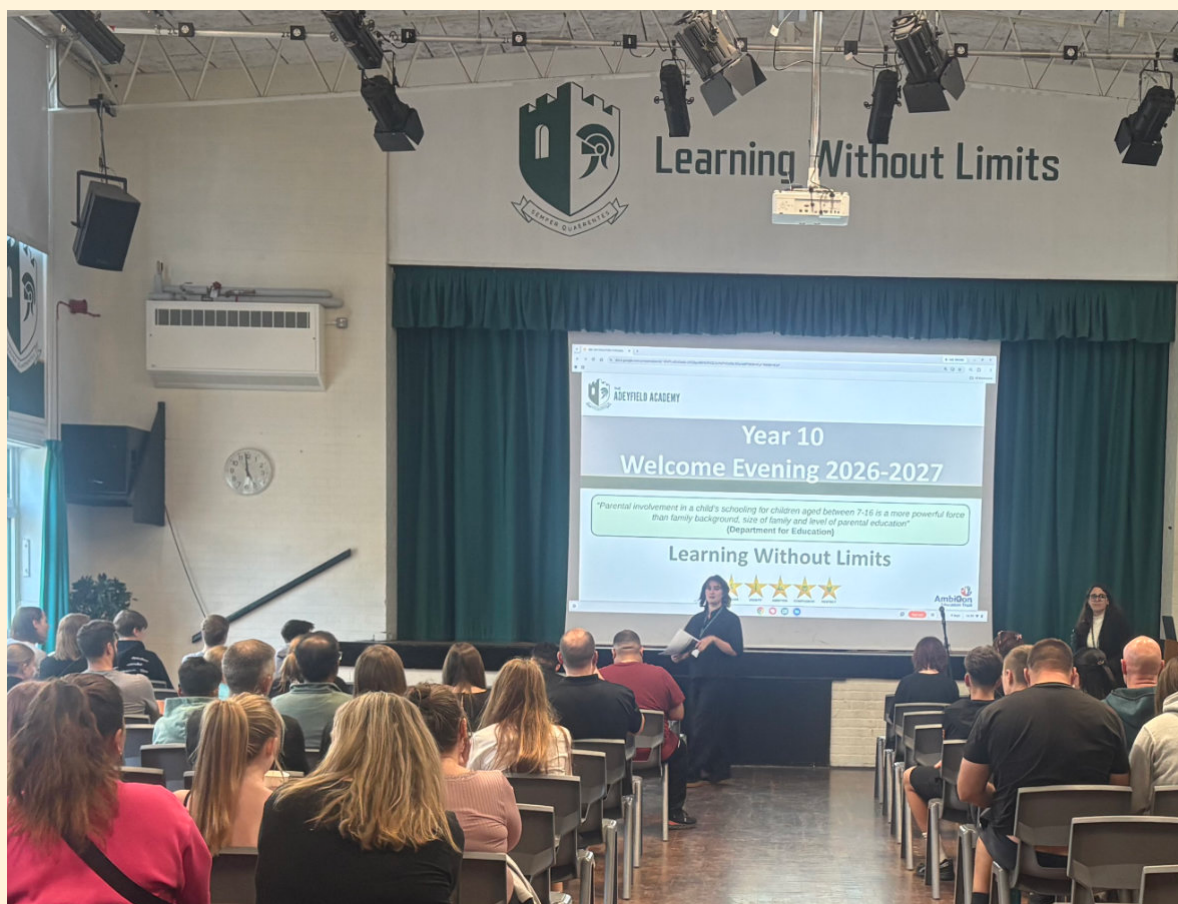

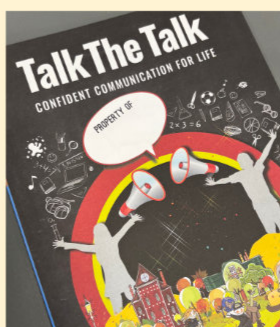
Throughout the fast-paced day, students stepped out of their comfort zones to practice key public speaking and communication techniques.

A central highlight of the talk was the mystery of the "Boston \$3 book"—a captivating story

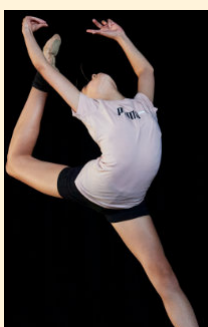

Didn't get the grades you wanted?

Whether you're feeling gutted, angry, or just confused, it's okay to feel that way. Bottling it up doesn't help, so give yourself permission to be annoyed for a bit.

Zoom out for a sec

One set of grades is a snapshot of one moment, it's not your whole future. You are more than a few letters or numbers on a page. Take a deep breath and remember: this moment does not define your worth or what you're capable of achieving.

What worked well?

What would I change next time?

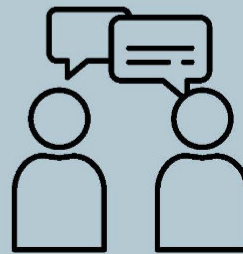
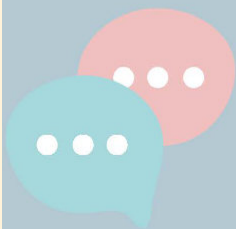
